$m{P}$ athways to Peace: the Wisdom of Listening, the Power of Commitment

Events in the world swirl around us. Daily reports of hatred, injustice and violence—often perpetrated in the name of religion—can leave us feeling helpless and discouraged. In the midst of such difficulties we struggle to understand, to find our way, to build a better world.

A way to begin is by listening. There is wisdom in listening to ourselves, to each other, to our traditions, to the world. Only by listening will our assumptions be challenged and our perspectives broadened. Only by listening will we have the opportunity to grow and to be enriched. Only by listening can we learn that we are not alone and that there is reason to hope. Only by listening will we be changed and, at the same time, discover that changing the world is possible. But change requires commitment. A commitment to live out the change we want to see in the world.

One place to find our footing is the 2004 Parliament of the World's Religions which will take place in Barcelona from July 7 through 13 in the framework of the Universal Forum of Cultures. This unique international interreligious gathering offers an engaging and promising forum to:

Deepen our spirituality, and experience personal transformation;

Foster mutual understanding and respect, and *learn to live in harmony* in the midst of diversity;

Recognize the humanity of the other, and broaden our sense of community;

Seek peace, justice and sustainability, and *actively* work for a better world.

And, in fact, in coming together to listen and to commit, this gathering itself will be

a pathway to peace.

The Parliament Experience

In 1893, during the Columbian Exposition in Chicago, the World's Parliament of Religions gave birth to organized interreligious encounter and marked the beginning of formal dialogue between the religious and spiritual traditions of the East and the West.

In 1993, the Parliament of the World's Religions was reborn in Chicago, with 8,000 people from around the world coming together to share their identities, to celebrate diversity and harmony and to explore religious and spiritual responses to the critical issues facing the global community.



In 1999, the Parliament in Cape Town called the world's attention to the interreligious movement's contribution to the struggle to overcome apartheid and build a new South Africa.

In 2004, the Parliament of the World's Religions—one of the most significant events of the Universal Forum of Cultures in

Barcelona—will invite the world to confront the challenges and model the possibilities of living peacefully in the midst of diversity.

The Parliament welcomes all people of faith, spirit, and goodwill to encounter the vast and rich diversity of the world's religious and spiritual traditions, to listen to each other with open hearts and minds, to dialogue for mutual understanding, to reflect on the critical issues facing the world, and to commit to discovering new pathways to peace.

The 2004 Parliament will open with a moving ceremony as thousands of adherents of the world's religious and spiritual traditions come together. In the days that follow, participants will engage in interreligious encounter and dialogue through lectures and workshops, plenaries and performances. In shared observances, meditation and prayer, persons from all walks of life will find inspiration and renewal. And in chance meetings in corridors and on the plaza, each will find that the world is paradoxically both a smaller and a richer place than she or he ever imagined.

The 2004 Parliament of the World's Religions is organized by the Council for a Parliament of the World's Religions, in partnership with the Universal Forum of Cultures—Barcelona 2004, and in association with the UNESCO Centre of Catalonia.

The Council for a Parliament of the World's Religions works with religious and spiritual communities and other guiding institutions in their efforts to achieve a more just, peaceful and sustainable world. The Universal Forum of Cultures—Barcelona 2004 is the driving force behind the creation of an international forum that is "open, innovative and participative for all cultures of the world."
